The year 2010 witnessed perhaps the highest all time lease bonus prices paid in Michigan over a wide area. Spurred by EnCana's apparently successful Utica-Collingwood formation gas well in Missaukee County, offers to purchase leases quickly escalated to \$1,000 per acre and in some areas that price doubled. The leasing fever lasted 7 months and was halted as quickly as it began. It remains to be seen if 2011 will see a resurgence of high dollar leasing. If it does happen, every landman will need to rely on his/her best negotiating skills to compete in this fast paced industry. - 1 Sq. Mile Regular Section = 640 acres
- 1 Acre = 10 sq. chains, 160 sq. rods, 43,560 sq. ft
- An acre is about 208 3/4 feet sq. An acre is about 8 rods wide and 20 rods long.
- 1 Sq. Rod = 30 ¼ sq. yards, 272 ¼ sq. ft
- 1 Sq. Foot = 144 sq. inches

- 1 Mile = 80 Chains, 320 Rods, 5280 feet
- 1 Chain = 4 Rods, 66 feet, 100 links

A special message regarding The Register of Deeds:

On November 9th the Ottawa County Board of Commissioners held a Public Hearing to study a proposal to combine the offices of Ottawa County Clerk and Ottawa County Register of Deeds. MAPL was asked to attend and make a statement as to our association's position on this issue. Sue Benson, Membership Chairman, attended on behalf of our association. She stated that the Land Records were vital to our industry and that the need for accurate and timely filing of Land Records was essential for us to perform our jobs. Because of this, the Register of Deeds Office could not take a backseat to the Clerk's Office. It was also stated for the record that MAPL was opposed to the combining of the two offices. The Grand Haven Tribune was taking a poll and we asked our Membership Body to vote. On November 23, 2010, the Ottawa County Board of Commissioners voted to combine the offices by a vote of 10 for and 1 against. The combination will take place in 2013 unless it is overturned at a future board meeting.
